5 in-prison volunteers visited prisoners weekly across **5** South Australian prisons, totalling **991+** volunteer hours.

These volunteer hours include prisoner third-party banking services in the community. Volunteers process over **500** banking transactions per annum.

437 children and young people received Christmas Angels presents at Christmas visiting times in prison and in the community, on behalf of an imprisoned parent.

"I just wanted to say a big thank you for all the great work you do. I still remember my first Christmas in jail... I filled out a Christmas Angels form and when it came close to Christmas, on a family visit prison guards brought out two presents for each of my children... They were so happy and excited to open those wonderful presents..."



671 home visits providing support to **65** families. **77** school uniform and shoes packages purchased to support childrens' education. **6** tutoring sessions.



28 camping opportunities provided through **5** Second Chances Mentoring Camps.

15 volunteer camp leaders donating over **186** hours to prepare and lead camps.



15 volunteers supporting the local community while raising funds for programs. **12** 'Care Start-Up' packages were provided with furniture packages from the Furniture Warehouse.



25 volunteers providing retail, collection and delivery services.

73 furniture packages distributed to vulnerable individuals and families assisting clients of **30** agencies.

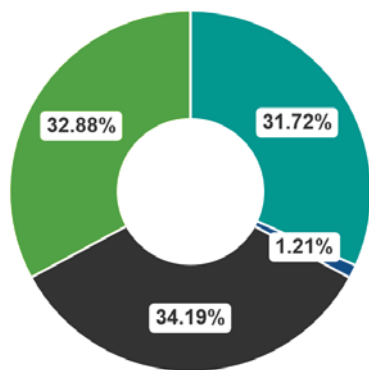

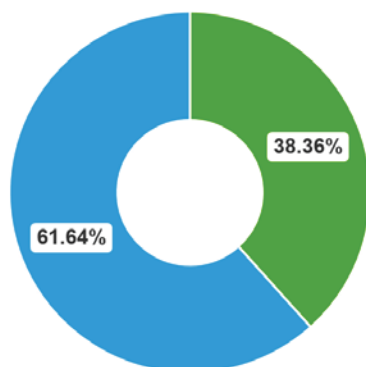

It took the collective work effort of all staff to achieve this and included the relocation of our container which held the storage of prisoner's property.

As the Interim Chair of the Board, I wish to thank fellow Board members past and present and especially Krystal Gurney our Treasurer since Second Chances SA commenced 8 years ago, who resigned for family reasons and her new vocational pathway.

We have been looking for suitable entrepreneurial Board members to strengthen our governance team as we're mindful of the retirement of CEO Helen Glanville planned for June 30, 2025.

We want to continue to provide for the children and youth impacted by the criminal justice system (No fault of them) mentoring activities, leadership development, improve school attendance, and job ready youth. We have the right people to do this, but we also need operational finances to make it happen. **If you can donate, please do it today!**
